## FINANCIAL AID POLICIES

In the case of divorced or separated parents, the school requires that both parents complete and submit application forms to FACTS. The school will consider the assets of both parents before making any award, and will not be bound by the assertion that one parent has disclaimed responsibility for educational expenses. If either parent has remarried, we also consider the assets of the step-parent, bearing in mind, of course, the obligations of that step-parent to his or her children from previous commitments.

Awards are revised annually and provision of continued aid is based on yearly qualification, musical and academic growth, and adherence to the school's standards. Parents are obliged to inform the school if there is any significant change in the family's income level or eligibility for aid during the school year.
